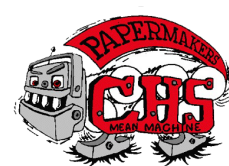

Rest of the 2024-25 All-Region football team: Offense



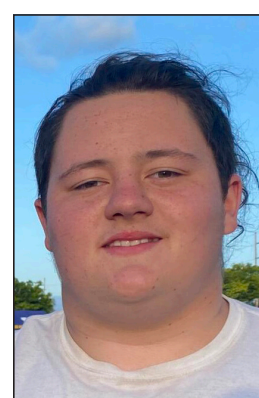
Kolten Gesser, Seton Catholic

WR: Senior impacted all three phases of game. Boise State commit earned 4A GSHL's co-offensive MVP.



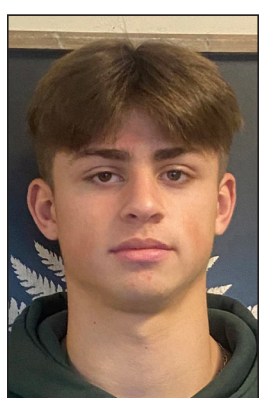
Juan Pasillas-Stanton, Mt. View

RB: Senior 3A GSHL's co-offensive MVP averaged 196 yards rushing per game, including two 300-plus-yard games.



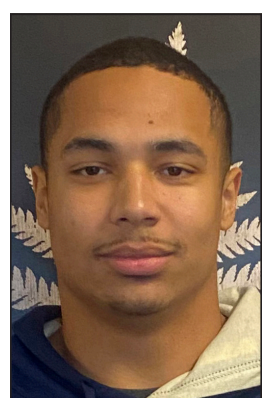
Ryker Ruelas, Seton Catholic
